Social Determinants of Health

How Superior is Removing Barriers to Care



Often, a person's overall health is affected by social factors such as housing, food and transportation. **These are known as social determinants of health.** Since 2020, Superior has taken a variety of steps to help address these factors and improve our members' well-being.



SUPPORTING THE COMMUNITY

In 2020, Superior provided \$400,000 to organizations to address the COVID-19 pandemic, and supported nearly 200 organizations through grants and sponsorships. For example:

\$120,000 To help with food and utilities, Superior supported 9 organizations across Texas that **serve people who have disabilities**.

\$100,000 Superior supported 16 food banks through donations, including in rural areas of the state that saw a significant increase in need.

\$65,000 YWCA El Paso del Norte Region received a grant from Superior to help provide quality childcare services for essential workers.



PROVIDING BETTER ACCESS TO RESOURCES

Superior partnered with <u>Aunt Bertha</u> to create Superior Community Aids and Resources (CARES), **a free online directory for members and employees** to identify resources in Texas communities. The top areas of need identified are housing, food, transportation and health.



ADDRESSING MEMBERS' NEEDS

Superior incorporated a 10-question survey into assessments, **screening 300,000 members in 2020**. This allowed Superior to learn about members' needs and how they may differ by product or program. Using the survey, Superior launched or expanded many initiatives, including:

- Superior provided \$70,000 to six organizations to fund hygiene closets, stocked with personal protective equipment and other items for people who have disabilities.
- Superior partnered with 13 schools for No One Eats Alone Day, a national initiative that helps students learn about social isolation, bullying and self-harm.
- Superior expanded its partnership with UT Health San Antonio to **support its mobile health clinic**, bringing care directly to low-income neighborhoods in San Antonio.

More than 98% of Superior members who live in one of our affordable housing properties are involved in the program, a tribute to the commitment of Superior and Prospera employees to serving those in need."
