## Partnership with Child Psychiatry Access Network (CPAN)

The Texas Legislature has expanded access to consultation and telehealth supports for children and youth with mental health needs, and their families, statewide through the Child Psychiatry Access Network (CPAN) (through Senate Bill 11 which passed in the most recent 86th Legislative Session).

CPAN is a statewide network of behavioral health consultation hubs located at Texas medical schools; Dell Medical School (Dell Med) is your region's hub. Each hub will provide pediatric/family medicine providers with the following services: telephonic clinical consultation during business hours with a child psychiatrist or behavioral health clinician; care coordination for assistance with referrals to community mental health services; and continuing professional education designed for primary care providers.

With support from the Michael and Susan Dell Foundation (MSDF), The University of Texas Dell Medical School (Dell Med) and the Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute (MMHPI) are working to engage and educate pediatric primary care providers in the Dell Medical School CPAN region about the opportunities available through the local CPAN model.
