

**Clinical Policy: Selumetinib (Koselugo)**

## **Description**

Selumetinib (Koselugo<sup>™</sup>) is a mitogen-activated protein kinase enzyme 1/2 inhibitor.

## FDA Approved Indication(s)

Koselugo is indicated for the treatment of pediatric patients 2 years of age and older with neurofibromatosis type 1 (NF1) who have symptomatic, inoperable plexiform neurofibromas (PN).

## Policy/Criteria

Provider must submit documentation (such as office chart notes, lab results or other clinical information) supporting that member has met all approval criteria.

It is the policy of health plans affiliated with Centene Corporation<sup>®</sup> that Koselugo is **medically necessary** when the following criteria are met:

## I. Initial Approval Criteria

## A. Neurofibromatosis Type 1 (must meet all):

- 1. Diagnosis of NF1;
- 2. Prescribed by or in consultation with an oncologist or neurologist;
- 3. Age between 2 and 18 years at start of therapy (see Appendix F);
- 4. Member has body surface area  $\geq 0.55 \text{ m}^2$ ;
- 5. Member has at least one inoperable and measurable PN, defined as a lesion  $\geq$  3 cm measured in one dimension:
- 6. Member meets one of the following (a or b):
  - a. Positive genetic testing for NF1;
  - b. Member has at least one other diagnostic criterion for NF1 (see Appendix D);
- 7. Complete resection of PN is not considered to be feasible without substantial risk or morbidity (e.g., due to encasement of, or close proximity to, vital structures, invasiveness, or high vascularity of the PN);
- 8. Dose does not exceed 100 mg (4 capsules) per day.

**Approval duration: 6 months** 

#### B. Other diagnoses/indications

1. Refer to the off-label use policy for the relevant line of business if diagnosis is NOT specifically listed under section III (Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized): CP.CPA.09 for commercial, HIM.PA.154 for health insurance marketplace, and CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid.



## **II. Continued Therapy**

## A. Neurofibromatosis Type 1 (must meet all):

- 1. Currently receiving medication via Centene benefit, or documentation supports that member is currently receiving Koselugo for a covered indication and has received this medication for at least 30 days;
- 2. Member is responding positively to therapy as evidenced by decreased or maintained volume of PN(s) from baseline;
- 3. If request is for a dose increase, new dose does not exceed 100 mg (4 capsules) per day.

**Approval duration: 12 months** 

## **B.** Other diagnoses/indications (must meet 1 or 2):

1. Currently receiving medication via Centene benefit and documentation supports positive response to therapy.

Approval duration: Duration of request or 6 months (whichever is less); or

2. Refer to the off-label use policy for the relevant line of business if diagnosis is NOT specifically listed under section III (Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized): CP.CPA.09 for commercial, HIM.PA.154 for health insurance marketplace, and CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid.

#### III. Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized:

**A.** Non-FDA approved indications, which are not addressed in this policy, unless there is sufficient documentation of efficacy and safety according to the off label use policies – CP.CPA.09 for commercial, HIM.PA.154 for health insurance marketplace, and CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid or evidence of coverage documents.

Appendix D: National Institutes of Health: Neurofibromatosis 1 Diagnostic Criterion

- Six or more café-au-lait macules (greater than or equal to 0.5 cm in prepubertal subjects or greater than or equal to 1.5 cm in post pubertal subjects)
- Freckling in axilla or groin
- Optic glioma
- Two or more Lisch nodules

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- A distinctive bony lesion (dysplasia of the sphenoid bone or dysplasia or thinning of long bone cortex)
- A first-degree relative with NF1

Appendix E: Recommended Dosage Based on Body Surface Area

<b>Body Surface Area</b>	Recommended Dosage
$0.55 - 0.69 \text{ m}^2$	20 mg in the morning and 10 mg in the evening
$0.70 - 0.89 \text{ m}^2$	20 mg twice daily
$0.90 - 1.09 \text{ m}^2$	25 mg twice daily
$1.10 - 1.29 \text{ m}^2$	30 mg twice daily
$1.30 - 1.49 \text{ m}^2$	35 mg twice daily
$1.50 - 1.69 \text{ m}^2$	40 mg twice daily
$1.70 - 1.89 \text{ m}^2$	45 mg twice daily
$\geq 1.90 \text{ m}^2$	50 mg twice daily

## Appendix F: General information

• FDA approval was based on SPRINT II (NCT01362803): Phase II Stratum 1 clinical trial. Eligible patients were 2-18 years of age with NF1 who had inoperable PN. Study consisted of 50 children ages 2-18, median age 10.2 (3.5-17.4).

NF1	25 mg/m <sup>2</sup> PO BID	100 mg/day
