Description

Pegzilarginase (AEB1102) is a recombinant human enzyme.

FDA Approved Indication(s) [Pending]

AEB1102 is proposed for the treatment of arginase 1 deficiency (ARG1-D)

Policy/Criteria

Provider must submit documentation (such as office chart notes, lab results or other clinical information) supporting that member has met all approval criteria.

It is the policy of health plans affiliated with Centene Corporation® that AEB1102 is medically **necessary** when the following criteria are met:

I. Initial Approval Criteria*

*Criteria will mirror the clinical information from the prescribing information once FDA-approved

A. Arginase 1 Deficiency (must meet all):

- 1. Diagnosis of ARG1-D confirmed by one of the following (a or b):*
 - a. Genetic confirmation of an ARG1 pathogenic variant;
 - b. Documentation of reduced arginase enzyme activity in red blood cells;
- 2. Prescribed by or in consultation with a physician experienced in treating metabolic disorders;
- 3. Age \geq 2 years;*
- 4. Provider attestation that member is currently on a protein-restricted diet and will continue this diet during treatment with pegzilarginase;
- 5. Documentation of plasma arginine level from within the last 3 months;*
- 6. Dose does not exceed the FDA-approved maximum recommended dose.*

Approval duration: 6 months

B. Other diagnoses/indications

1. Refer to the off-label use policy for the relevant line of business if diagnosis is NOT specifically listed under section III (Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized): CP.CPA.09 for commercial, HIM.PA.154 for health insurance marketplace, and CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid.

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II. Continued Therapy*

*Criteria will mirror the clinical information from the prescribing information once FDA-approved

A. Arginase 1 Deficiency (must meet all):

- 1. Currently receiving medication via Centene benefit or member has previously met initial approval criteria;
- 2. Member is responding positively to therapy as evidenced by a reduction in plasma arginine levels since initiation of therapy;*
- 3. Provider attestation that member is currently on a protein-restricted diet and will continue this diet during treatment with pegzilarginase;
- 4. If request is for a dose increase, new dose does not exceed the FDA-approved maximum recommended dose.*

Approval duration: 12 months

B. Other diagnoses/indications

1. Refer to the off-label use policy for the relevant line of business if diagnosis is NOT specifically listed under section III (Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized): CP.CPA.09 for commercial, HIM.PA.154 for health insurance marketplace, and CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid.

III. Diagnoses/Indications for which coverage is NOT authorized:

A. Non-FDA approved indications, which are not addressed in this policy, unless there is sufficient documentation of efficacy and safety according to the off label use policies – CP.CPA.09 for commercial, HIM.PA.154 for health insurance marketplace, and CP.PMN.53 for Medicaid or evidence of coverage documents.
